Corruption in many forms has been one of the pervasive problems affecting India. For decades the red tape bureaucracy and the License Raj had strangled private enterprise. The economic reforms of 1991 have cut some of the worst regulations that had been used in corruption. Corruption is still large. The TI India study estimates the monitory value of petty corruption in 11 basic services provided by the government, like education, health care, judiciary, police, etc. to be around Rs. 211 billion.

Another important aspect is India's labour force, which is growing by 2.5% every year, but employment is growing only at 2.3% a year. Official unemployment exceeds 9%. Almost 30% workers are casual workers who work only when they are able to get jobs and remain unpaid for the rest of the time. Only 10% of the work force is in regular environment.

From the overall stock of an estimated 458 million workers, 394 million (86%) operate in the unorganized sector.(of which 63% are self employed) mostly as informal workers. There is a strong relationship between the quality of employment and social characteristics. Present government is continuously doing an effort to create more job avenues in manufacturing sector which can deal with the problem of unemployment.

Children under 14 constitute 3.6% of the total labour force in the country. Child labour is a complex problem that is basically rooted in poverty. The Indian government is implementing the world's largest child labour elimination program, with primary education targeted for ~250 million.

Environmental degradation is another aspect to worry for. The major concern is ecological imbalance leading to changes in biodiversity, Energy crises and rapid increase in water borne diseases. The untreated water is used for drinking, bathing and washing because of partial water treatment facilities.

In areas where people cook with fuel wood and coal over open fires, more than 4 billion people suffer continuous exposure to smoke. In India, particulate concentrations in houses are reported to range from 8300 to 15000 micro gram per mt3.

To tackle with the issue of poverty, Indian Government is continuously putting efforts to encourage Women employment. It is strongly believed that, communities where woman have empowered have a higher social capital. Woman promote corruption free environment and can also solve the problem of child labour by increasing the earnings for the family. Women are better placed at resource management which can minimse the problem of environmental degradation. Women have the most important attribute of being responsible in their duties.
