5. Disadvantage of semester system

- 1. Students are confined only to their course contents.
- 2. They do not get time for extensive studies. As a result of this, the knowledge of students becomes restricted, and is limited to a very narrow perspective.
- 3. Semester system is comparatively expensive.
- 4. Semester system faces inadequacy of time. Most of the times teachers fail to complete the syllabus in time. Students who join late will face lot of difficulties to catch the subject and complete the revision.
- 5. Semester system increases workload as the evaluation process is conducted twice a year.
- 6. Semester system does not give any scope for extra classes due to lack of time.
- 7. Semester system restricts co-curricular activities as most of the time teachers are engaged in completion of syllabus and students are involved in revision of completed syllabus.
- 8. Students have to manage the syllabus in short time.
- 9. Sometimes, teachers cannot convey the whole knowledge of the subject due to short time
- 10. Students do not get time for extra study; as a result they just have basic knowledge of the subject
- 11.In semesters system, students do not get chance to re-evaluate their papers, so they have to manage and maintain their grades
- 12. Time passes very quickly and it does not let students to have complete knowledge about the subject.

6. Definition of annual system

Annual system is defined as a full term of studies without any break. It is the traditional system it covers more syllabus compare to semester system. At the end of the year exam is conducted. In this system ones the students enter the college he feels free and thinks about studies during the year university gets enough time to prepare question paper. Number of examiners and examinations also can be reduced. Which become more economical for university.
