## 2. What is Value?

Hodgkinson defines morality as following:

‘A value is a concept of the desirable with motivating force.’ (M. Karthikeyan, Ethics, Integrity and Aptitude)

Defining the term value is one of the most difficult concepts in ethics because it can be defined from various perspectives, that is, philosophical, sociological, psychological and so on. Though values are indefinable, they are not unintelligible. It can be defined by pointing out an instance or it can be with regards to an object of interest, it can be seen as a process of realization, it can also be seen as judgements on objects which are verifiable by experience.

Rokeach defines values as ‘Values are beliefs about how one ought or ought not to behave, or about some state of existence worth or not worth attaining. Values are abstract ideals, positive or negative, that represent a person’s belief about ideal modes of conduct and ideal terminal goals.’ (M. Karthikeyan, Ethics, Integrity and Aptitude)

Values are generally learnt in the process of socialization right from his/her childhood, and though internalization of values happens throughout our lifetime, it is more rapid in the early stages. Experience one gains transforms into values.

In professional fields, values are important because an individual's behavior is definitely conditioned largely to the values he or she has internalized. Values help to determine whether an employee is passionate about work and the workplace, which in turn can lead to above-average return, high employee satisfaction, strong team dynamics and synergy. Values are usually shaped by many different internal and external influences, including family, traditions, culture and recently media and internet. ### 3. What is Morality?

Charles Colson defines morality as following:

'Morality describes what is. Ethics describes what ought to be.' (M. Karthikeyan, Ethics, Integrity and Aptitude)

The word morality is derived from the Latin word *moralis*, meaning traditional customs or proper behavior. These morals are given out by the society at large, or a particular community, or might have religious sanction, or even exist within one's family. Thus, these morals judge the actions of individuals whether they are right or wrong, and if it goes against the existing morals, it is termed as immoral. Morals can be defined in accordance with individual's behavior.

In short, morals are the set of principles associated with person's conduct and behavior with the society and community. Morality is the recognition of that structure of principles based on which the person deals the world and response to the world. Morality is the foundation based on which person's ethical self has been developed. Morality guides the person to choose right and wrong. Virtue and vices etc. Morality becomes most important concept with regards to ethics in profession because profession without morality is just a job for salary and not to attain integrity for duties. ### 4. What is Ethics?

In a broad sense, ethics the study of what is right and wrong in human behavior. Ethics is the set of beliefs about what is morally correct or acceptable.

Mackenzie defines ethics as following:

"Ethics is the study of what is right or wrong in human conduct or the science of the ideal involved in human life." (M. Karthikeyan, Ethics, Integrity and Aptitude)

Theodore Roosevelt said 'to educate a man in mind, but not in morals is to create a menace to society. (M. Karthikeyan, Ethics, Integrity and Aptitude)

Ethics as the science of morality criticizes vague and sometimes inaccurate, popular notions of right and wrong, vice or virtue. Ethics exposes the defects and inconsistencies of customs and usage of social, political and religious institutions, and gives us a real insight into the nature of the moral ideal. Ethics teaches us how important is morality not only by exposing the errors but by criticizing those erroneous notions. It also prepares oneself to move forward constructively; it helps us to separate essential from non-essential, the spirit from the form, constant from temporary and thereby helps us to distinguish right from wrong, virtue from vice and benefits from harm.

Nearly all people acknowledge the importance of ethics. Unfortunately, very few really understand ethics as well as they think they do or as well as they should. Ethics can be meaningfully discussed and

applied only when it is fully understood. This understanding requires a periodic revisiting of the basics. So;

Ethics is about right and wrong.

Ethics is about virtue and vice.

Ethics is about benefit and harm.

While ethics encompasses all of the above, it is more simply about ‘fixed, universal rule of right conduct that are contingent on neither time nor culture nor circumstance. And yet, it is also about character, ‘the traits, qualities, and established reputation that define who one is and what one stands for in the eyes of other’. Lastly, it is about example, ‘an established pattern of conduct worthy of emulation’.

## 5. What is Profession?
